

West Hub Righting Relations Micro-Grant Program Description and Application

Righting Relations Canada (RR) is a heart-centred, Canadian network of adult educators and community organizers working to contribute to decolonization and radical social change. The network works to strengthen the capacity of adult educators and community organizers by using popular education methodologies to develop critical consciousness and build a just Canada.

Over the past five years, Righting Relations has built three key hubs across the country to create regional networks and localized connections that work together to influence change. The three hubs are The Eastern Hub (Atlantic Canada), Central Hub (Ontario and Quebec) and The West (Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba).

Announcement of Microgrants

This one-time funding (microgrants) is available to adult educators in Righting Relations Canada. Microgrants are available to support projects or activities rooted in Adult Popular Education that foster community connection, build capacity, enhance community vibrancy and health, promote political and economic literacy, and/or support Indigenous, immigrant, refugee, and low-income communities across the West Hub (Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba). Total funding for each project or activity ranges between \$500 to \$1500.

These grants can be offered to individuals or groups who are members of Righting Relations and must engage and benefit underserved and/or marginalized communities. Projects should start after March 30, 2025, and be completed by December 2025.





Criteria for Project Selection:

- Uses popular education models that can be built upon and shared;
- Projects or activities with capacity for transformative change;
- Provides practical education and learning;
- Benefits the community, especially the most marginalized within the selected community.

Application dates and process

- Grantees will be notified by March 30, 2025.
- Applications can be shared in Word or PDF format, and use no more than two pages in length to address the following questions:
